## **LEAD VET COMMENTARY**

This year marked the third clinic held on Tongatapu in memory of our dear friend and colleague Angela Glover. Her legacy continues to inspire meaningful outreach and this clinic remains a special part of SPAW's calendar.

Unlike our other Tongatapu clinics, "Ange's Clinic" as we refer to it, operates from a different village hall each day — bringing care directly into communities across the island. This mobile format adds layers of complexity to daily logistics but the 2025 team took it all in stride. Remarkably, the three other volunteers who joined me for the week were all new to SPAW and to Tonga, yet their work ethic and commitment to the cause was faultless and as a result helped achieve yet another outstanding clinic result.

Thanks to their efforts, 532 animals on Tongatapu are now healthier, safer and better cared for.

These clinics are never a solo effort. We were expertly supported by the Tongan MAFF staff, TAWS volunteers and VSA team members Dr Jade Hackney and Mhirron French. Their contributions, both in preparation and throughout the week, were essential to the clinic's success.

Ella Burke, a young expat whose parents are stationed in Tonga with the Australian Defence Force, has assisted us during previous clinics primarily in patient recovery and surgical support. This year she stepped up to volunteer alongside me, allowing one of our SPAW nurses to focus on more complex procedures. Ella's initiative and reliability made a real difference.
